

SEGREGATION (UNTOUCHABILITY) AND SLAVERY

SEGREGATION (UNTOUCHABILITY): The Chicago region's deeply entrenched patterns of segregation extract a steep price in lost lives and unrealized economic growth, according to a study². The seven-county area's murder rate could be cut by 30 percent, its economy could churn out an additional \$8 billion in goods and services and its African-American residents could earn \$3,000 more a year if it could reduce racial and economic segregation to the median level for the nation's largest metro areas. And 83,000 more residents could have earned bachelor's degrees, spurring an additional \$90 billion in collective lifetime earnings. Those were the findings of a study by the Metropolitan Planning Council, a Chicago-based public policy research group, and the Urban Institute, a Washington think tank.

While the seven-county region has seen a slow reduction in racial and economic segregation from 1990 to 2010, it remained fifth-worst among the nation's 100 most populous metro areas in 2010, the most recent full census year, the study found. The region includes Cook, DuPage, Lake, Kane, Kendall, McHenry and Will counties. The nation's four most segregated regions were Philadelphia; Bridgeport, Conn.; New York; and Milwaukee, in that order. The study comes as the region experienced a population loss in 2016, the second year in a row. Many of those leaving the area are African-Americans moving to warmer climates in search of stable jobs and safe neighborhoods as gun violence continues to scar Chicago's South and West sides. The study assessed segregation in three ways: African-American/white, Latino/white and by economic status for the 100 most populous regions in 1990, 2000 and 2010, measuring progress over that period. The researchers then analyzed how Chicago fared on income measures, life expectancy, college attainment and homicides relative to the other regions.

Allegedly, the city of Chicago has taken steps since 2010 aimed at easing segregation and strengthening affordable housing requirements for new developments, and Cook County made it illegal for landlords to discriminate against prospective tenants who have rent-subsidy vouchers. But unless metro Chicago cranks up the pace of desegregation efforts, it will lag on African-American/white segregation until 2060 to and 2070, the study predicted.

THE AMERICAN KAFALA OF 11.5 MILLION SLAVES

Kafala Is A System Of Control. In The Migration Context, It Is A Way For Governments To Delegate Oversight And Responsibility For Migrants To Private Citizens Or Companies.

The word *Kafala* means sponsorship in Arabic. The migration management system of America enables exploitation and forced labor under the threat of penalty of deportation and imprisonment akin to modern-day slavery. This system has different names in different regions: In the Arab land it is called *Kafala* and in America it is called illegal alien or criminal alien. The majority of the migrants are low-wage construction or service-industry workers, or domestic workers who toil under even harsher restrictions with far fewer protections. But even highly-paid and professional workers have suffered due to sponsorship regulations. All foreign residents are subject to the American *kafala* system³. Rigid sponsorship laws and regulations continue to define the choices and conditions of the millions of migrant workers in the US. The American system allows Coyotes to traffic workers⁴. Workers cannot change jobs, quit jobs, or seek help, because they are the so-called illegals in America. Workers with proper and legal documentation have limited rights in the US, as they are the so-called aliens. If a worker leaves a job without permission from the USCIA, the cancel his or her temporary visa, automatically turning the worker into an illegal resident in the country. Workers whose employers cancel their residency visas often have to leave the country through deportation proceedings, and many have to spend time behind bars.

The terms human smuggler or coyote are used for people who smuggle people illegally across borders. Coyote fees, which are the fees charged by coyotes for their services, are a measure of the extent of people's desire to migrate. Coyote fees may include the costs paid for document forgery and other costs needed to avoid being caught by immigration enforcement authorities. Mexicans who enter the United States illegally by crossing the southern border pay coyote fees of about \$3000-4000 (data from the Mexican Migration Project). Illegal Asian immigrants to the United States pay considerably larger sums of money to get inside, probably in the tens of thousands of dollars. Some estimates suggest fees of \$75,000 for some illegal Chinese immigrants.

In The Conservative Case for Immigration Tariffs⁵, Alex Nowrasteh, the immigration policy analyst at the Cato Institute's Center for Global Liberty and Prosperity, writes the following: Costs vary widely based on the mode of transport, distance travelled, the number and characteristics of those being moved, price discrimination, and local conditions like the cost of avoiding detection by immigration authorities. Unauthorized Mexican immigrants usually pay \$4,000 to cross the border on foot or \$9,000 by boat and there are an

estimated 6.6 million of them living in the U.S. as of 2010. The smuggling fee for unauthorized Central American immigrants is currently between \$7,000 and \$10,000. In 2010, there were an estimated 1.5million unauthorized immigrants from El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras residing in the U.S. The smuggling fee for an unauthorized Chinese immigrant is about \$75,000 and thereabout 130,000 unauthorized Chinese immigrants in the U.S. as of 2010. The most recently compiled averages in 2005 show that Asian unauthorized immigrants pay \$26,041 to come to America, Europeans pay \$6,389, and Africans pay \$2,200. Unauthorized smuggled migrants from Central and South America pay a lower price than Asians because the distance is shorter, but the chance of detection is very high for Hispanic immigrants. Many smuggled Chinese are brought directly to American port cities like San Francisco or New York, but large numbers are also dropped off in Mexico and guided across the southern border. The smuggled migrants do not have a green card, work permit, or other legal work authorization waiting for them in the U.S. when they arrive, but they still pay enormous sums of money.

A TRAFFIC TICKET

Tax Paying Aliens Can Become Criminal Aliens For A Traffic Ticket

A nonresident alien's income that is effectively connected with a trade or business in the united states, and us source income that is Fixed, Determinable, Annual, Or Periodical (FDAP) effectively connected income, after allowable deductions, is taxed at graduated rates.

These are the same rates that apply to US citizens and residents. Effectively Connected Income should be reported on page one of Form 1040NR, US Nonresident Alien Income Tax Return. FDAP income generally consists of passive investment income; however, in theory, it could consist of almost any sort of income. FDAP income is taxed at a flat 30 percent (or lower treaty rate, if qualify) and no deductions are allowed against such income. FDAP income should be reported on page four of Form 1040NR.
